Message from Father Aaron Respect Life Month: "Be not Afraid"

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

October is *Respect for Life Month* in which we turn particular attention to the gift of human life that God has given us. We hold life as a most precious gift of God during all ages and circumstances of life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.

During these past several weeks there have been so many of our brothers and sisters from our nation and beyond who have suffered and are still suffering greatly form the recent natural disasters and tragedies. In times of human tragedy we often look for life's meaning and the purpose of such suffering. What is God's plan in all this? Or, where is God in times of uncertainty and pain? Our Catholic Faith tells us that while God is the Master and Creator of all things, all knowing and with power over all, he is also a God with a patient, gentle and loving hand. Suffering and evil in the world are not created by God, nor does he take delight in human suffering, although in his infinite wisdom and love, he has the power to allow suffering for a greater good. God is so great that he can even use evil to bring about good.

In the mystery of life's joys, beauty and suffering God is always and ever present to us. "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Mth 28:20) God is the Good Father who never leaves the side of his children, especially in difficult times. It is in this promise that we find the strength to not only go on, but to go out, and find others who have been wounded on the battlefield of life and bring them the Father's healing balm of mercy.

Some questions to consider in our desire to defend and care for human life are; *How do we respond when our aging parents are in failing health? Do they know how much we love them and cherish each day given? Do we ensure they know they are never a burden to us? In our own challenging times, do we ask for support? When others are in pain and suffering how do we respond generously? When someone is pregnant in difficult circumstances, do we show compassion that tangibly supports her and helps her welcome the life of her new little one?*

St. Paul says, "My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus. To our God and Father, glory forever and ever. Amen." And also, "I can do all things in him who strengthens me." May God strengthen and provide for us through the storms of life and may he grant us his life in abundance.



- EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -Recognize God in your ordinary moments

Art Buchwald, the longtime humorist for the "Washington Post" who died in 2007 is credited with saying, "The best things in life aren't things." As Christians, we know this statement to be true. Certainly the best things in our lives are not those items that money can buy or things we can create in the material world. Faith, hope, and love are more precious than anything we can see with our eyes. Yet, as humans we often find ourselves longing for the very things that we claim are not nearly as valuable. We lose sight of what is real and true.

Paul wrote in the fourth chapter of his Letter to the Philippians that he has experienced both living with abundance and then with very little. Regardless of what we have in terms of worldly goods, Paul reminds us that God provides for all our needs. God may not provide for our wants, but he does give us what we need.

The flesh seeks what it wants, but the spirit seeks what it needs. In a stewardship way of life, we must always remind ourselves that true wealth never comes from material possessions and money. True wealth comes from the love we share, the faith we develop, and the hope we bring to others. The best things in life aren't free, though. They require work, commitment, and fortitude. We need to cultivate these things daily. If we are serious about living life in this way, we will find that when our days on this earth are through, we really had it all.
