

A Message from Father Aaron Mary and a New Year

Dear brothers and sisters,

As we complete the Christmas Octave (the 8 day celebration) of the Birth of Christ the Lord, the Word made flesh, we celebrate two wonderful feasts in the Catholic Church; the Solemnity of the Holy Family and the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. You may ask, what is the Octave? I'm glad you asked.... In the Old Testament, circumcision was sign of the covenant between God and Abraham, and thus between God and the Jewish people. The oath of this covenant was sealed by the act and sign of circumcision. It was on the eighth day that this important event took place. This tradition was carried over into the New Testament. As Catholics we love Christmas so much we celebrate it not just one day, but all week long!

This Sunday is the Solemnity of the Holy Family of Nazareth, as our focus now turns to the life of the Child Jesus cared for by mother Mary and father Joseph. What a powerful model of obedience to the Father and prayerfulness the Holy Family is for all. The "yes" of Mary and Joseph truly changed the course of history. May all families earnestly seek out their heavenly assistance in all circumstances to be victorious over the many challenges of our day.

Then, on Monday January 1st we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. This liturgical celebration is key to our belief in Christ's Divinity. Christ, as we know, was truly God and truly man. Mary, therefore, must be the Mother of God. Fittingly, we begin a new year with Mother Mary, the humble virgin woman who whose singular cooperation with God's plan changed time forever.

As many of us seek to make New Year's resolutions for 2018 we will hopefully make spiritual resolutions as well. What are the ways that we can grow closer to God this year? What are spiritual practices that could help us to be better Christians and servants of those in need? Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Pray to a Patron Saint daily
- 2. Pray more (or at least 10-15 minutes a day)
- 3. Practice random acts of kindness
- 4. Pray the rosary (simple yet powerful!)
- 5. Attend daily Mass
- 6. Go to monthly confession
- 7. Visit the elderly frequently
- 8. Listen to Catholic radio (1180 AM)
- 9. Read a good Catholic book



WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: What can I do to help our family practice our faith each day?

Answer: Some families practice their religion together as just another event on their schedule: go to church, observe Lent, help at the parish picnic, go to a meeting, volunteer time, make your confession, use your envelope... But the focus needs to be on who we are--God's people, in relationship with him, loved, forgiven, and redeemed, and called to live and proclaim the Gospel. Our awareness of God's presence and our sense of mission are supported by the daily rituals, celebrations, and traditions that help us stay focused. Sharing our faith strengthens us and clarifies the beliefs and values of Christian living.

Daily family practices include time for prayer—before meals, before bed, before important meetings and activities. Attend Sunday Mass together and discuss the homily afterward. Create family celebrations for holy days and holidays. Make religion a regular part of your discussions. Include others, especially the elderly and the less fortunate, in your activities and charitable efforts. By applying the virtues of faith, hope, and love to each day, faith becomes part of who your family is. It influences how you act towards others. what you value, and how mindful of God you are. Faith is the leaven of life that helps all of us rise to our calling and dignity as God's people.
