A Meditation:*

“According to the common witness of the gospels, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead took place on “the first day after the Sabbath”...On the same day, the Risen Lord appeared to the two disciples of Emmaus...and to the eleven Apostles gathered together...” Pope John Paul II, Dies Domini, #20
