Did vou know?

Did you know that January 17th marks the feast day of the patron saint of the Church of St. Anthony? St. Anthony has many names including St. Anthony the Great, St. Anthony of Egypt and St. Anthony the Abbot! At age 20, Anthony's parents died making him a rich man. Anthony heeded the words from the Gospel of Matthew where Jesus tells a rich man to "go, sell what you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven." and gave away all he had and fled to the desert. After a time he started living a hermitic life and began his own life of prayer and penance alone with God. He spent most of his life arguing and wrestling with the devil. Around the age of 55 people started coming to him for healing and spiritual guidance. Anthony built two monasteries where the monks supported themselves by making and selling brushes and baskets. St. Anthony died on January 17th in the year 356 at the age of 105. Saint Athanasius wrote about St. Anthony saying, "Anthony was not known for his writings nor for his worldly wisdom, nor for any art, but simply for his reverence toward God." You can see St. Anthony's life depicted in the stained glass windows on each side of the church under the rose (round) windows.
