A Message from Father Aaron

A Reason for Hope and a Call to Action

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

St. Peter tells us in the second reading, "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope." It was with hope that I prayed before the joint parish council meeting this past Tuesday that we would be able to move forward in agreement with a plan for three Masses each weekend. I had been praying and thinking about this arrangement since the time I was assigned last spring and was told of the four-Mass schedule.

This spring alone there have been four Saturday funerals, which adds up to five total Masses on a weekend, and the danger of the eventual burnt-out of a priest. I wish that things could be different but I, firstly, must manage my own health, energy and availability as the Spiritual Father of two parishes in a variety of settings and responsibilities. I realize this will mean inconvenience and sacrifice on your part, but I hope for your understanding and prayers through this transition, realizing that there will never be a schedule that pleases all people.

In collaboration with the both parish councils, as well as Tom Keaveny, director of Pastoral Planning the New Ulm diocese, (who is implementing the Fourth Planning Process at parishes in the diocese) it was decided that the new Mass schedule will be as follows: Saturday Mass: 5:30 at Assumption Parish, Sunday Mass: 8am at Assumption Parish, and Sunday Mass: 10:00am at St. Anthony's parish. This schedule will initiate on the July 1st-2nd Masses. After one year the councils will review the current schedule and discuss possible adjustments.

The current schedule leaves St. Anthony with one Mass simply because all worshipers can be easily contained in the Church during a single Mass. Whereas the size of worship space at the Assumption Church would be too small on many Sundays. This change will hopefully aid needed ministries during Mass that can be difficult to fill such as; music, servers and ushers. It will also fill many empty spaces in the pews and make for fuller responses, singing and hopefully more spiritual energy, instead of a dispersed and empty environment. Keep in mind that 46 of the 75 parishes in the New Ulm diocese have a single Mass each weekend. Also, note that for those who fear this to be a move toward closure, St. Anthony's PVI (parish vitality rate) is amongst the higher group of parishes in the diocese, and so those fears would be groundless. There has been no discussion of this happening.

The days we live in are concerning and, in fact, there is a crisis of faith across the globe! We have seen a great decrease in the number of priests (37 priests for 75 parishes in New Ulm, 65 priests for 130 parishes in St. Cloud) and we have also seen a severe drop in the practice of the faith and Mass attendance. So the question is, what are we going to do about it?

Hope in Christ calls us forward to renew our efforts to firstly pray for an increase in vocations and an increase of faith. We must double our efforts of prayer. We know our communities and our world needs it! Also, we are called to invite others back to faith and participate in the salvation of souls for Christ. As Bishop LeVoir has said, "Active parishioners are being asked to invite back home those who have left the practice of the faith. It is clear. It is not possible to continue operating as we have been."

I will continue to pray each day for all of you and our parishes of St. Anthony's and Assumption. I know you will do the same. May the Holy Spirit open our hearts to God's plan of love and salvation in Jesus, and may the Blessed Mother guide and protect us always.
